**Sir Horse:** Neigh! Greetings!

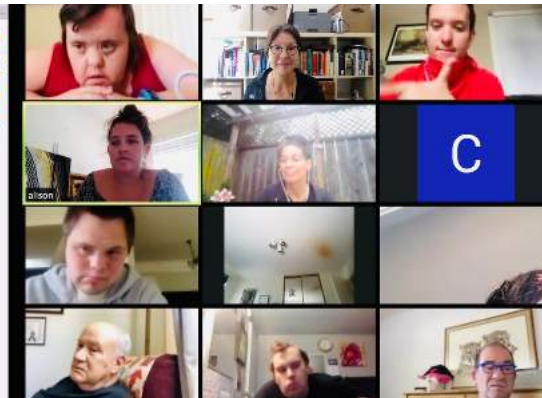
**Announcer:** With the topic of laundry...today's first question is, "How important is your owner's laundry choices to you?" **Calamity Cat?**

**B) How many cups of beans, in total, did Alison use in her recipe?**

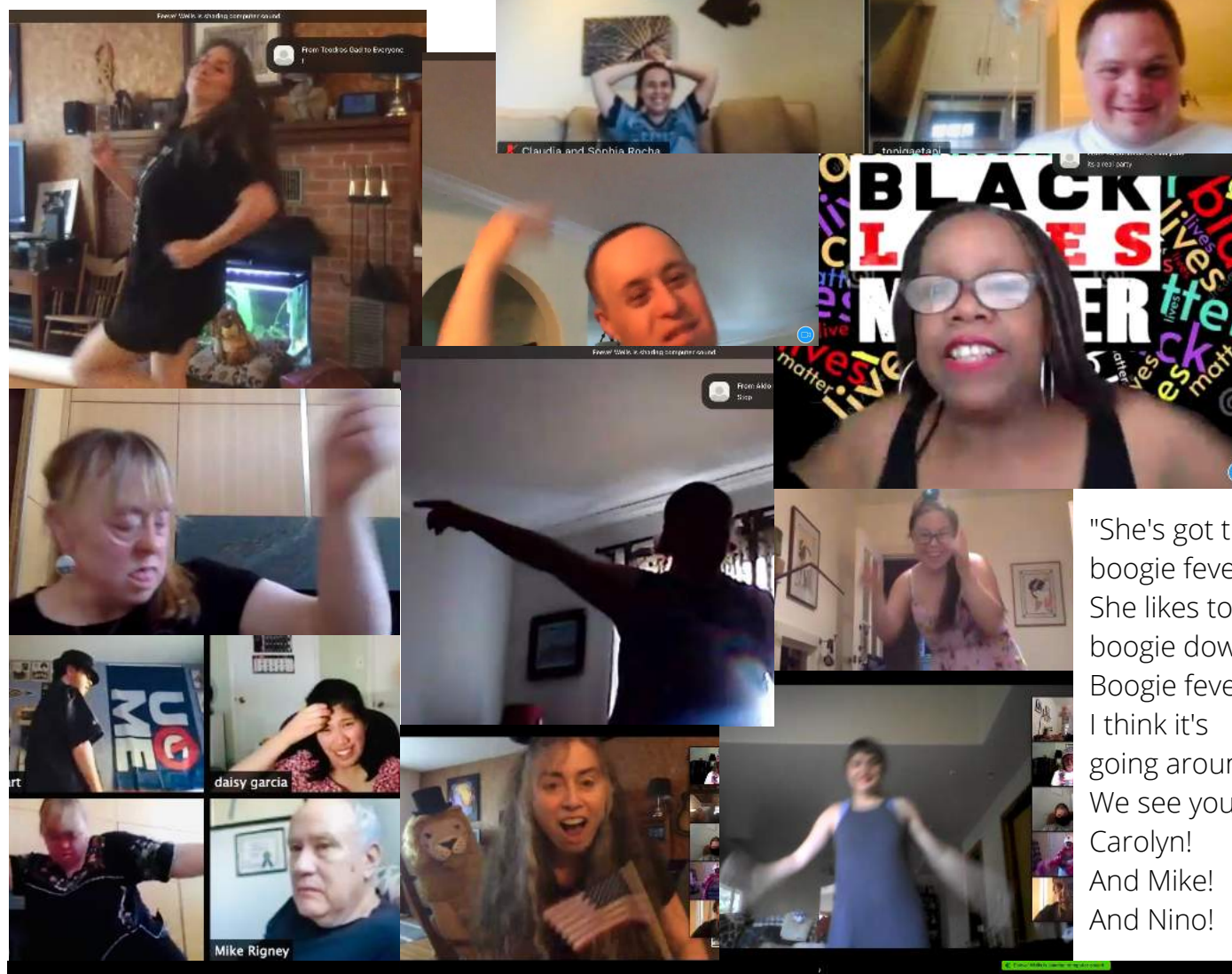


**Answer:** A) Garbanzo beans which are also called chickpeas, B) 1/3 cup times 2 = 2/3 cup of beans.

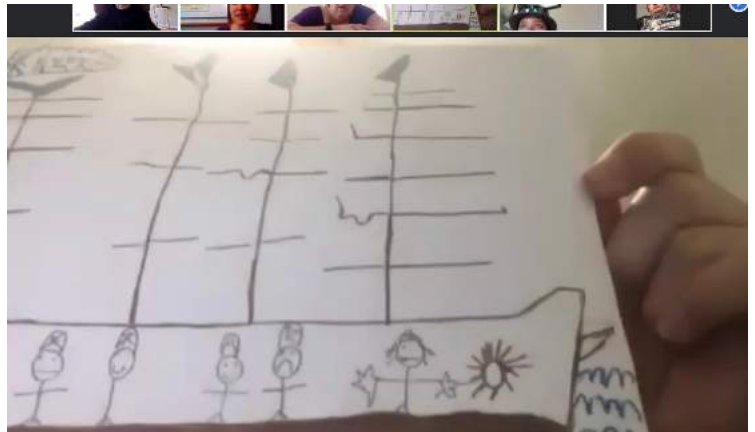

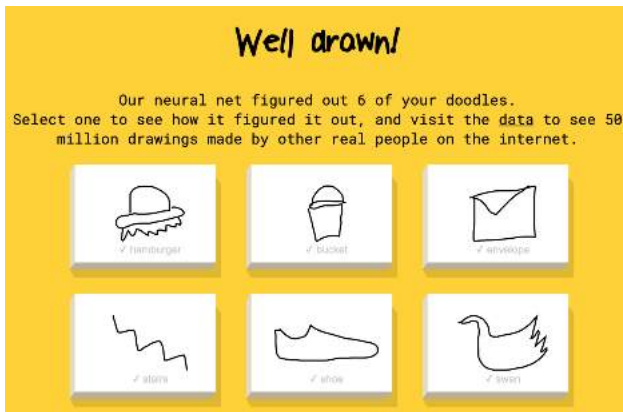
## THE HUB Remote Learning with The Arc SF


## World Music Class

# August 1st is National Clown Day

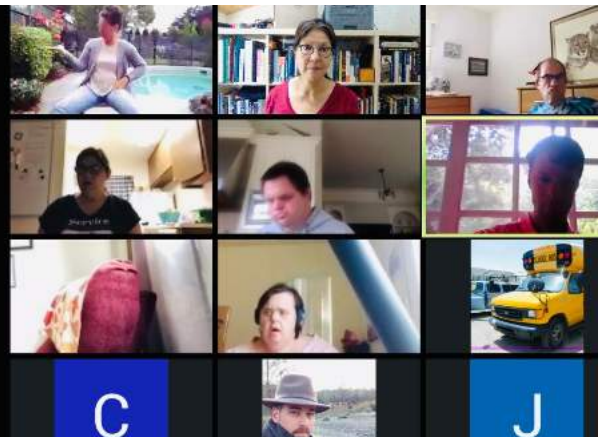
## International Clown Week is August 1st-7th!

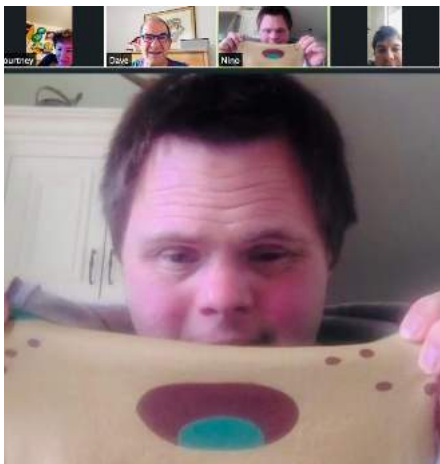

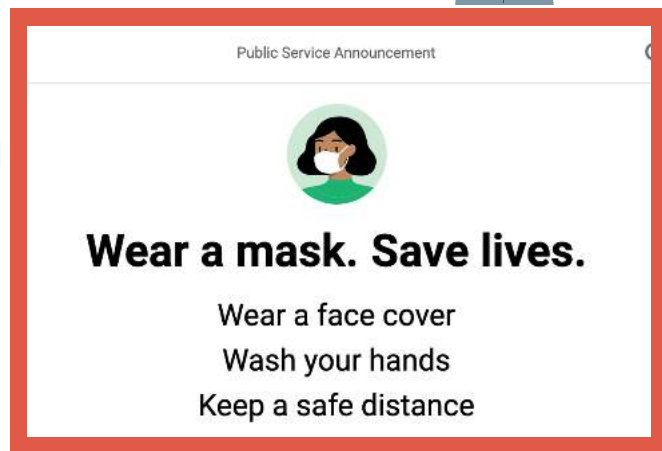

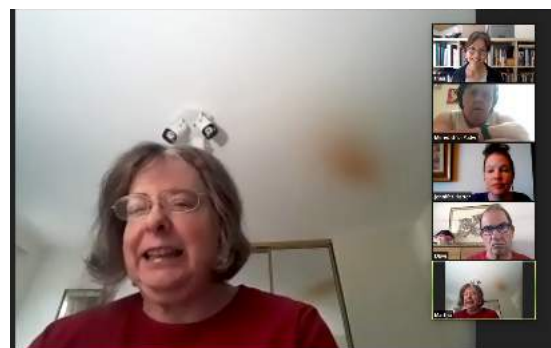

# Ancient Philosophy Class

We discussed Buddhist philosophy and we learned about the Four Noble Truths:

The Buddha said: "Oh *bhikkhus* (the monks he was teaching), there are four noble truths. They are the noble truths of *dukkha*, the cause of *dukkha*, the cessation of *dukkha* and the path to the cessation of *dukkha*."



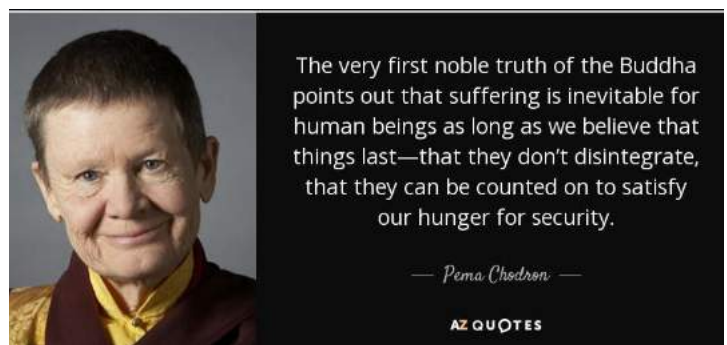
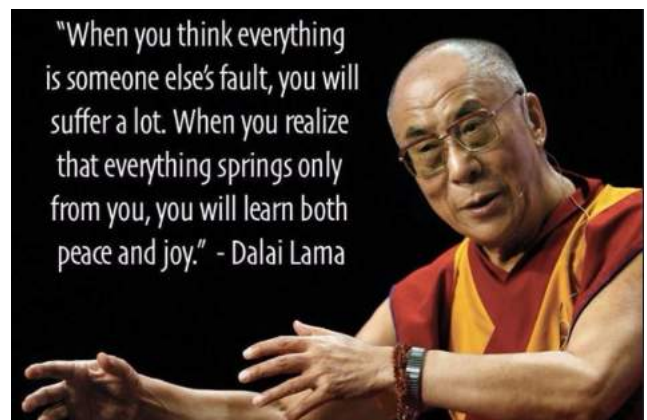
So what is *dukkha*? In ordinary usage *dukkha* has been translated as suffering or misery. However, in the First Noble Truth, the meaning of *dukkha* is much wider and includes ideas such as unsatisfactoriness, dissatisfaction, frustration, separation, and emptiness.

So *dukkha* can be anything from not getting your way to spraining your ankle to not wanting good times to end to having to wait too long to be called on in class, to sickness, old age, and death.

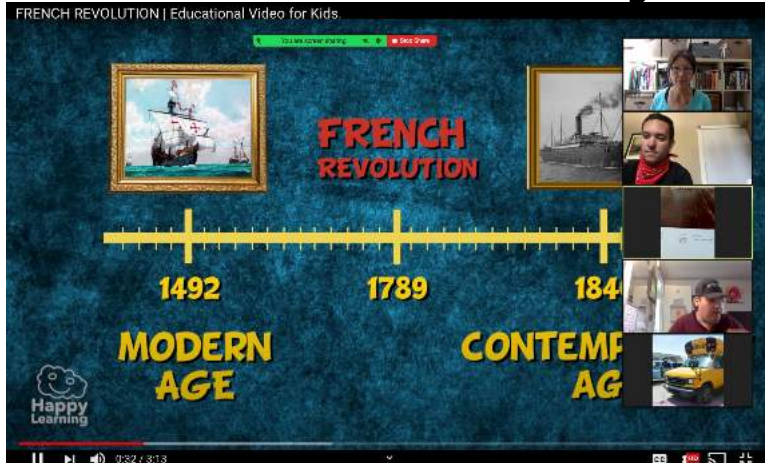
The point of the First and Second Noble Truths is that wanting/needing things to be different than they are right now is the core cause of unsatisfactoriness/suffering.

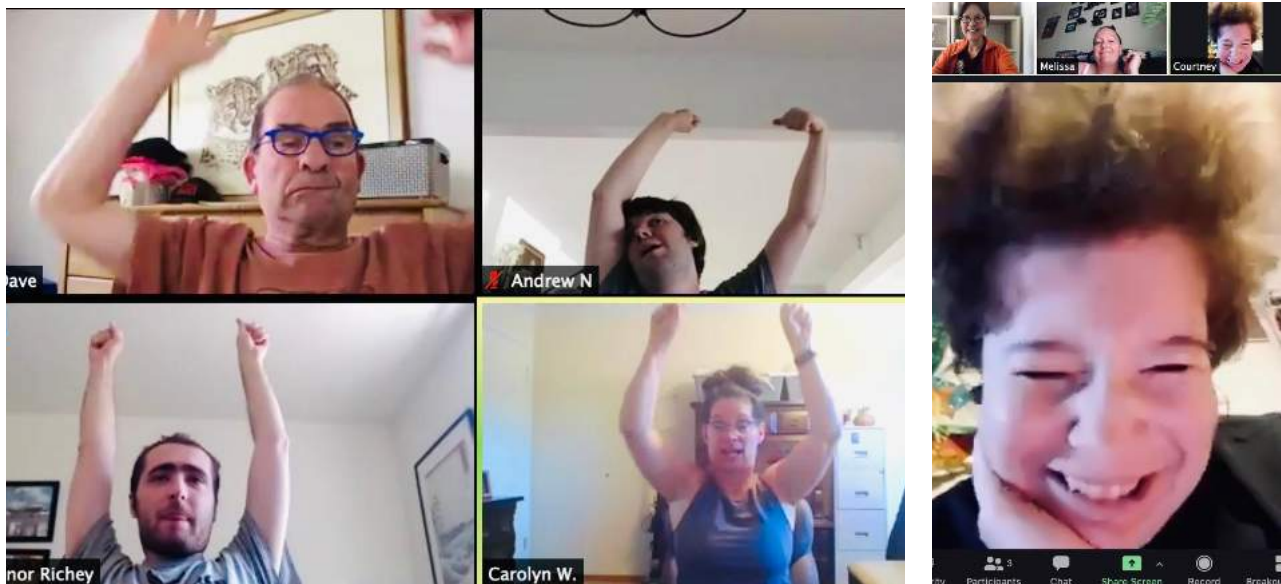
