

Theater Arts Class






Like all theater professionals, we begin our class with a warm up and we end with a cool down.

In nutrition class, Alison made hummus. She measured out 1/3 cup of beans.







World Music Class


In World Music Class we traveled from Sweden to Mexico to Korea. Nino could not stay seated when we listened to Swedish music, including ABBA, and this artist here...



Ancient Philosophy Class

We discussed Buddhist philosophy and we learned about the Four Noble Truths:

The Buddha said: "Oh bhikkhus (the monks he was teaching), there are four noble truths. They are the noble truths of dukkha, the cause



of dukkha, the cessation of dukkha and the path to the cessation of dukkha."

So what is *dukkha*? In ordinary usage *dukkha* has been translated as suffering or misery. However, in the First Noble Truth, the meaning of *dukkha* is much wider and includes ideas such as unsatisfactoriness, dissatisfaction, frustration, separation, and emptiness.


So *dukkha* can be anything from not getting your way to spraining your ankle to not wanting good times to end to having to wait too long to be called on in class, to sickness, old age, and death.


The point of the First and Second Noble Truths is that wanting/needing things to be different than they are right now is the core cause of unsatisfactoriness/suffering.

International Lefthander's Day is August 13th


- Lefthander's Day is observed every year to celebrate the uniqueness and differences of the left-handers.


