

We Planted Candy Corn!

Have you ever wondered where candy corn comes from? Well, this fall, it grows in our garden! When Bruce and Judy harvested the last of the towering sunflowers from the Life College garden, they thought the stalks were too interesting to compost, so they set them aside to dry and waited for an idea for how to use them to strike. They also saved the corn husks from the corn plants, which were too cool to toss.

Nino, Hayley and Michelle carved and painted giant 10" foam candy corns. Since the wind and/or critters took our stash of corn husks, we bought a big package of them at a local market. Assembly involved a little trial and error, including poking holes in the corn husks and weaving them onto the sunflower stalks, and staking the foam candy corn onto the tippy tops. Then the garden crew got to work planting candy corn!





How Does Our Garden Grow?

Candy corn has been around since the 1880's. It was originally called "Chicken Feed"--the packaging had a brightly colored rooster and the slogan said "Something Worth Crowing For". Before landing on the corn kernel shape, the creator of candy corn tried chestnuts, peapods, and turnip shapes. He used to feed trial batches to his chickens, who apparently loved the corn shaped the best! These days, candy corn is made with commercial machinery, but each piece used to be poured one color at a time, and formed by hand. Candy corn is one of the better-for-you Halloween candies-it's fat-free, and each piece is about 7 calories. More than 9 million pieces of candy corn are made every year.

October 30th is National Candy Corn Day. If you are a fan, and your candy corn sweet-tooth hasn't been totally satisfied after Halloween, good news—there are other holiday versions out there! Keep an eye out for red and pink Cupid Corn for Valentine's Day, pastel Bunny Corn for Easter, and red and green Reindeer Corn for Christmas. If you're feeling truly adventurous, try Tail Gate candy corn, with fruit punch, vanilla ice cream, hot dog, hamburger, and popcorn flavors, or Thanksgiving Dinner candy corn with green beans, roasted turkey, cranberry sauce, ginger glazed carrots, sweet potato pie, and stuffing flavors!




We Made Apple Pie!


















Bowtie, Fusilli, and Spaghetti: What's the Difference?

October 17 is National Pasta Day! Here are some interesting pasta facts for you:

Pasta isn't just pasta. The shape changes everything—how it holds sauce, how it cooks, and how it feels to eat. Let's break down four popular types: bowtie, farfalle, fusilli, and spaghetti.

- **Farfalle vs. Bowtie:** They're the same pasta. Farfalle means butterflies in Italian, but English speakers often call them bowties. The pinched middle and ruffled edges make them great for thick, creamy sauces or pasta salads.
- **Fusilli:** This is the twisty one. Fusilli looks like a corkscrew or spiral. That shape helps trap bits of sauce, herbs, and cheese in every curve. It works well with chunky sauces, pesto, or baked pasta dishes.
- **Spaghetti:** Long, thin, and round—spaghetti is the classic pasta for red sauces like marinara and meat sauce. It twirls easily and cooks fast, making it a favorite for quick meals.



- Farfalle has been around since the 1500s.
- Fusilli was traditionally made by wrapping pasta around knitting needles.
- A single strand of spaghetti is called a *spaghetto*.
- Different shapes, different uses. Pick the right pasta, and your dish gets better! Who knew?





NATIONAL TRAIN YOUR BRAIN DAY



Mighty Morphin' Power Rangers

3 Seasons (1993 -1996)

When the Zords are combined they form the mighty Megazord, which they use for kaiju battles. My sister introduced me to the show when she was 12 and I was 4. Buffy the Vampire Slayer

7 seasons (1997 - 2002)



Buffy the Vampire Slayer takes place after the events of the 1992 film of the same name. In every generation there is a "chosen one", who stands up to the forces of darkness (see: vampires) in the world. In the show, Buffy has just transferred from Hemery High School (the location in which the events in the movie took place) to Sunnydale High School. Throughout the show, Buffy and her friends must defeat various supernatural threats while also attending school and navigating its social landscape. My favorite episode is **Angel**, in which Buffy discovers that Angel, her love interest in the beginning of the show, is a vampire. This was a big deal for Buffy and the show's viewers. I would rate this show a **9.2/10**.

Daniel Reviews 6 Seasons of Xena


Xena Warrior Princess 6 Seasons (1995 - 2000)



The first time I saw Xena Warrior Princess I was about 12 or 13. I liked the action sequences and the stunt choreography (even though the special effects were third rate and cheesy). WHY BREAST CANCER AWARENESS HITS HOME FOR KATIE

For Katie, breast cancer awareness https://www.nationalbreastcancer.org/breast-cancer-awareness-month/ isn't just a cause—it's personal.

Her mom, Trish, was first diagnosed in 2011. After a grueling year of treatment, she went into remission. From 2012 to 2014, things felt hopeful.

Then the symptoms came back.

Trish's belly started to swell. She grew more uncomfortable. At her niece's engagement party—the last family event she ever attended—she wore a poncho to cover the changes in her body. Still, she smiled. She showed up. She stayed strong. Trish had already beaten cancer once. She'd lost her hair, endured the worst, and promised she'd beat it again. She fought like hell the second time too. She truly believed she'd make it.

But not every fight ends in victory.

A few years after losing her mom, Katie turned 30. Instead of gifts, she asked friends and family to donate to breast cancer awareness in Trish's name.

That's who Katie is—someone who turns grief into purpose.

Katie's message for October (Breast Cancer Awareness Month):



Get Checked. Don't Wait.

Katie now speaks out regularly, urging women to do self-exams, schedule regular checkups, and visit their OB/GYNs. Because early detection saves lives.

What Everyone Should Know About Breast Cancer

- It's not just a women's disease. About 1 in 833 men will get breast cancer in their lifetime. It's rare—but real.
- Left breast = slightly higher risk. For reasons still unknown, breast cancer is a bit more common in the left breast than the right.
- Most lumps aren't cancer. Around 80% of breast lumps are benign but don't ignore them. Get checked.

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

- **Survival rates are up.** Thanks to better screening and treatment, the 5-year survival rate for localized breast cancer is now around 99%.
- **Dense breasts = higher risk.** Women with dense breast tissue may need more than a standard mammogram.
- **Lifestyle plays a role.** Staying active, maintaining a healthy weight, and limiting alcohol all lower your risk.
- **Breastfeeding can help.** Breastfeeding—even for a short time—may slightly reduce the risk of breast cancer.
- **No family history? Still at risk.** Most people diagnosed with breast cancer don't have a family history. Only 5–10% of cases are genetic.
- You may be eligible for free screenings. Many organizations offer free or low-cost mammograms, especially in October. Don't skip yours.

Katie's story is about more than remembrance—it's about action. *Educate. Support. Show up.* Because someone's life might depend on it. And this—this is the last photo Katie took with her mom. It means everything. A moment frozen in time, and a reason to keep fighting.
